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SOUTHERN PUNJAB POVERTY ALLEVIATION PROJECT (SPPAP) PHASE IV

(INTERNATIONAL FUND OF AGRICULTURE DEVELOPMENT THROUGH GOVT OF PUNJAB)

The Government of Punjab, with the generous financial support of the International Fund of Agriculture Development (IFAD), initiated the SPPAP project. The SPPAP Phase III implementation kicked-off in September 2020 in both North and South Punjab, and it was successfully completed in March 2023. As of 2023, 10,082 trainees have passed out in multiple trades. Training to the participants is given as per the market needs. SPPAP-VTO addendum to the agreement signed to implement SPPAP Phase-IV with target of 15,000 trainees. Project Budget is PKR 900 million and project duration is 5 years from April 1, 2023 to March 31, 2028.



PUNJAB HUMAN CAPITAL INVESTMENT PROJECT (PHCIP) (WORLD BANK THROUGH GOVT OF PUNJAB)

The Punjab Social Protection Authority (PSPA) has received financial support from World Bank through Government of Punjab for execution of Punjab Human Capital Investment Project (PHCIP). The project aims to increase the access to quality health services, economic/social inclusion of the poor households and social protection service delivery platform in selected districts of Punjab. IRM in collaboration with National Rural Support Programme (NRSP) has been awarded the rights to carry out the Economic Inclusion (EI) component of the project in district Bahawalpur & Muzaffargarh (Package I) and district Rajanpur & Rahim Yar Khan (Package II). During the period, In Package I, 965 mentors have been identified, while 812 mentors have been trained, 26,995 project beneficiaries have been enrolled, 22,686 Labor market readiness training has been conducted for beneficiaries, Livelihood investment formation has been conducted for 20,884 and 9,117 tangible and intangible assets has been transferred.

During the period, In Package II, 1,198 mentors have been identified, while 787 mentors have been trained, 27,438 project beneficiaries have been enrolled, 23,262 Labor market readiness training has been conducted for beneficiaries, Livelihood investment plan formation has been conducted for 20,648 and 10,027 tangible and intangible assets has been transferred.

NEW PARTNERSHIPS INITIATIVE EXPAND – HUMAN DEVELOPMENT ACTIVITY (HDA) (PALLADIUM THROUGH USAID)

Imagine a world where every child has access to a quality education. That's exactly what IRM is striving to achieve with the Palladium/USAID funded NPI Expand, HDA project in District Dir Upper. By working with teachers, headteachers, academic supervisors, and PTC members, IRM is providing professional development opportunities to improve teaching standards, managerial and leadership skills. These efforts are benefiting the teachers and the students who will receive high-quality education. What's unique about this project is its focus on the Minimum National Standards for Quality Education (MNSQE) and the specially developed Quality Standards for Teacher Education by E&SED KP. Teachers are not only learning the best practices in teaching but also how to deliver it effectively. The project is operational in 103 girls' schools, including 89 primary and 14 middle/high schools, across 3-4 adjacent tehsils of District Dir Upper. With the project's help, these schools are transforming into centres of excellence in education, providing a brighter future for the children of the region. For the month of May, 13 teacher trainings were held with the participation of 237 female teachers.



IRM SMART Schools

IRM Smart School programme aims to provide primary education to out-of-school children in a multi-grade classroom setting. The Smart Schools are located in areas that are not served by government schools, and provide education to around 30 students per teacher. The schools follow the government syllabus and prepare students for board exams at the end of 5th grade.

IRM Pakistan is committed to providing the necessary resources and support to ensure the success of its Smart Schools. The organization provides teacher training on multi-grade teaching methodologies, as well as uniforms, stationary and other support to students. Additionally, IRM also provides regular medical check-ups to students, and new learning techniques and innovations to keep students engaged and motivated. At present, 107 schools are operational in Punjab, Sindh and Islamabad with a total of 3,781 students enrolled having a gender ratio of 53% girls and 47% boys.



Driving Women's Economic Empowerment (BRITISH ASIAN TRUST)

Driving Women's Economic Empowerment (DWEE) project is to promote economic empowerment among women through vocational training. This project is specifically designed to empower women by equipping them with the necessary vocational skills, knowledge, and Business Development Services to enhance their employability and entrepreneurial capabilities. Here are descriptions of activities conducted during the month of May 2023.

Ongoing vocational training: IRM is currently providing vocational skill training to 130 women at five designated centers.

Completion of an end-line survey for batch 1: As part of the DWEE project, a survey was conducted at the end of the training program for the first batch. This survey aimed to evaluate the progress and impact of the vocational training received by the women participants.

Development of a comprehensive end-line database: Following the end-line survey for batch 1, a detailed database was created. This database contained valuable information and insights obtained from the survey. The data was shared with British Asian Trust (BAT).

Partner's meeting/Learning Forum: To encourage collaboration, knowledge sharing, and mutual learning, a meeting or learning forum was organized for project partners. Various stakeholders came together to discuss and exchange ideas, experiences, and best practices.

Mobilization sessions conducted by IRM staff at training centers. These sessions aimed to engage and motivate the participants by emphasizing the importance of market connections, generating business ideas, and clarifying the purpose and goals of the training program.



Water for Life

Under the initiative "Water for Life," the Institute of Rural Management (IRM) has been actively involved in supporting people living in water scarcity areas. Recently, IRM successfully implemented the installation of two hand pumps in the communities in district Jamshoro. These hand pumps have significantly alleviated the hardships faced by the people by providing them with accessible drinking water and fulfilling their household needs. Prior to this intervention, the women and children in the community had to travel a distance of 2 kilometers to a canal to fetch water for their households. IRM ensured that water is safe for drinking, for this purpose IRM get the certificate from PCRWR – water quality testing laboratory.

With the installation of these hand pumps, approximately 250 community members will benefit directly from the availability of water in close proximity to their homes. This intervention not only addresses the water scarcity issue but also contributes to the safety and well-being of children and women, as they no longer have to travel long distances for water, reducing potential protection concerns.
